Why does she ...?

Why do we let the abuse continue?

Violence against women is not only a question of victimisation but one of perpetration

Our questions need to include the abuser as the problem and part of the solution

Do we have the right responses

- Recognise
- •Respond
- •Refer
- Record

Respect matrix of use and experience of IPV IN coercive control OVER UNDER coercive control partner/ex, because of own FROM partner/ex use of use of violence, abuse, violence, abuse, controlling controlling behaviour, threats behaviour, threats etc Uses or has used physical Perpetrator of Victim (IPV) who or non physical force has used some intimate partner against partner/ex form of violent violence resistance Experienced or Perpetrator (IPV) Victim of intimate experiencing physical or whose victim has partner violence non physical force from partner/ex used some form of violent resistance

Critical skills to increase safety

- Distinguish between unhappy, conflicted relationships and coercive control and fear
- Recognise who is doing what, to whom and with what consequences
- Refer appropriately
